

1. WHO IS REQUIRED TO GO THROUGH THE REVIEW?

Art majors are required to participate in the portfolio review for entry into the Fine Art Concentration.

2. WHAT IS THE REVIEW?

The review is a faculty evaluation of student work, from a minimum of 18 credit hours completed in the following courses. Drawing I, Drawing II, Design I, Design II, 3-D Design, and Introduction to Computing for Art.

5. WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE WORK IS SUBMITTED?

Fine Art Concentration Coordinators will review student applications and the required portfolios. The FAEPR will result in an "accept" or "deny" into the concentration. The student who is accepted into the Fine Art Concentration may begin the concentration sequence of courses. A student who is denied may remain in the art program and resubmit a portfolio in the next FAEPR. Students cannot enter the Fine Art Concentration if they have been denied twice. If denied twice, a student would need to choose another concentration to pursue a B.F.A. in Art at Mississippi State.

3. WHEN WILL THE REVIEW TAKE

PLACE? For students interested in the Fine Art Concentration (Ceramics, Drawing, Painting, Printmaking, and Sculpture), the FAEPR will take place during the Spring semester.

6. WHEN WILL STUDENTS BE NOTIFIED AFTER THE WORK IS SUBMITTED?

Students applying for entry will be informed of their acceptance or denial two weeks from the application/portfolio due date. The Fine Art Concentration Coordinator will be responsible for getting word to the applicants.

4. WHAT DO I NEED TO DO IN ORDER TO PARTICIPATE IN THE REVIEW?

A. As soon as possible, contact the Fine Art Concentration Coordinator to get information on the requirements for the review.

B. Prepare digital portfolio by photographing all required artworks.

C. Submit portfolio along with the required Fine Art Entry Portfolio Review information to msuart.submittable.com by the due date. Contact the Fine Art Concentration Coordinator to get more information on the specific application procedures and portfolio requirements for the FAEPR. Application forms are available in the Department of Art Office.



This review is for students entering the Department of Art's Fine Art Concentration at Mississippi State University. Students must complete the Submittable FAEPR Application Form and submit it with a digital portfolio of required artwork. The FAEPR is held during the Spring Semester.

A Portfolio must include the required artwork. The correct JPEG <u>or</u> PDF file name must be attached to each uploaded file of artwork. High quality documentation and presentation of your work is important. Photos should be made in balanced lighting with a neutral background. Avoid using a flash.

File formats include: jpg and pdf. Images should be 72 dpi and 1000 pixels in the shortest dimension.
